<b>Course Description</b>	<p>The lectures and seminars will analyse:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– the historical roots of European fascism,</li> <li>– the economic, social, political and ideological background, and circumstances of fascist transition of Germany,</li> <li>– the Mediterranean Area and South-Eastern Europe,</li> <li>– the traditions and mentality of these societies,</li> <li>– the events of fascist takeovers in Italy and in Germany</li> <li>– the most important characteristics of „one-party” systems and the “NAZI” totalitarian state</li> <li>– the aggressivity of fascism,</li> <li>– the road to the collapse of fascism.</li> </ul>
